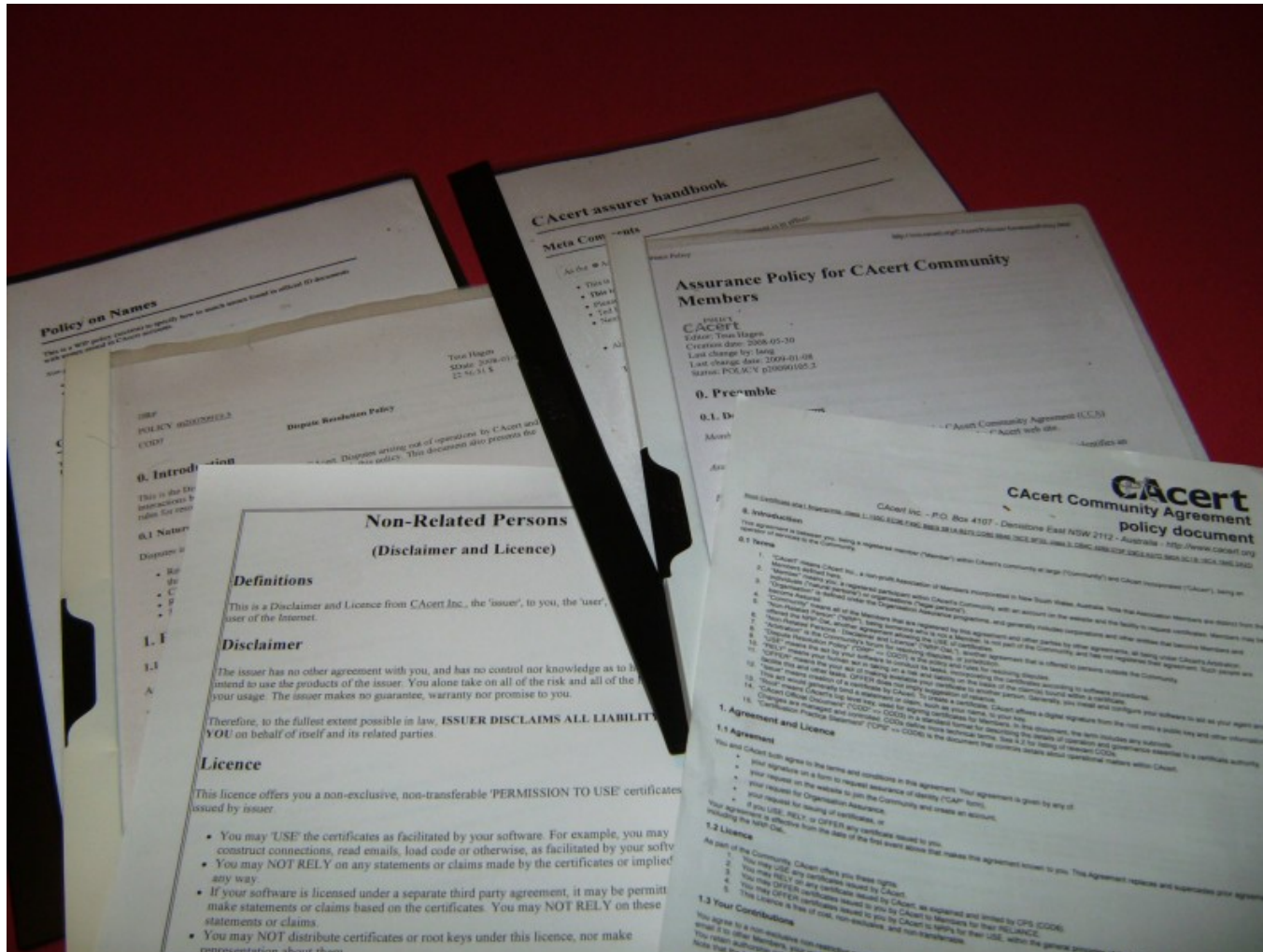

- The Assurance Statement is a **C**Acert **A**ssurer **R**eliable **S**tatement 
- Will be used to reliable transfer information for the audit
- Adopted by the arbitration system

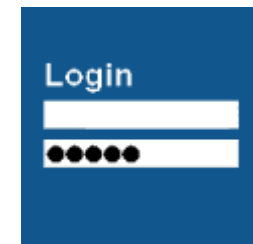
